

Tibetan poetics from Daṇḍin's *Kāvyaḍarśa* (*snyan ngag me long*)

*snyan ngag me long* (*Mirror of Poetry*)

- First translated into Tibetan in part by Sakya Paṇḍita (late 12<sup>th</sup> century), translated in full a century later
- Divided into three chapters:
  - **First Chapter:** 'Faults' of Poetry
  - **Second Chapter:** *don rgyan* (*arthālaṃkāra*) ornaments of sense/meaning, which includes various types of simile, metaphor, and numerous other devices including poetic 'mood'
  - **Third Chapter:** *sgra rgyan* (*śabdālaṃkāra*) - ornaments of sound The category of *sgra rgyan* refers to any poetical ornament or device that uses sound or words to create pleasure such as onomatopoeia, alliteration, repetition of vowel sounds, etc

*nyams ldan gyi gyan* (*rasa-alaṃkāra*)

- In Sanskrit context, originally applied to drama/plays only (*nāṭya*)
- Later developments applied to poetry as well
- Among the poetic ornaments highlighted in Sakya Paṇḍita's *mkhas pa'i 'jug pa'i sgo*.
- The number of *rasa*-s has varied throughout history, but eight are presented in the *me long*. A mood is created by the intensification of its corresponding stable emotion .

Stable emotion - *sthāyibhāvas* (*gnas can* or *gnas byed*) Poetic Moods - *rasa- alaṃkāra* (*nyams ldan gyi gyan*)

<b>Wonder</b> ( <i>vismaya</i> ):	<i>ngo mtshar</i>	<b>Amazing rasa</b> ( <i>ādbhuta rasa</i> )	<i>rmaḍ byung ngam ngam</i>
