Emergency Preparedness

Did you know that ...

- Tippecanoe County has more tornado touchdowns on average than any other county in the state?
- On campus, seven outdoor all hazards warning sirens sound during tornado warnings, active threats such as a shooting on campus, and hazardous materials releases.



Emergency Preparedness

- On Tuesday Mar 20th, at approx. 10:15 AM, Indiana will conduct its annual tornado drill as part of the state's "Severe Weather Preparedness Week".
- The purpose of the drill is to provide a reminder to prepare and practice so that when an emergency occurs, we are ready to take the necessary action to protect ourselves.
- Purdue will also conduct a voluntary campus-wide tornado warning drill to help the Purdue family prepare for tornadoes.

Emergency Procedures

The outdoor all hazard warning sirens on Purdue's campus mean dangerous circumstances are occurring on campus and signal you to immediately go inside the closest building to seek more information.

 Emergencies may include severe weather, an active threat (such as a shooting) or a major hazardous chemical release.



Emergency Procedures (2)

Once inside, seek shelter based on the emergency:

- Tornado warning: On the lowest floor of the building away from glass
- 2. Active threat, such as a shooting: In a room that can be locked, barricaded, or secured in some way.
- 3. Major hazardous materials incident: In an interior room above ground with the fewest windows or vents
